DAVE EGGERS

Dave Eggers is the author of many books, among them The Eyes and the Impossible, The Circle, The Monk of Mokha, Heroes of the Frontier, A Hologram for the King, and What Is the What. He is the founder of McSweeney's, an independent publishing company, and co-founder of 826 Valencia, a youth writing center that has inspired over 70 similar organizations worldwide. Eggers is winner of the American Book Award, the Muhammad Ali Humanitarian Award for Education, the Dayton Literary Peace Prize, the TED Prize, and has been a finalist for the National Book Award, the Pulitzer Prize, and the National Book Critics Circle Award. He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Letters.

RIGOBERTO GONZÁLEZ

Rigoberto González is the author of 18 books of poetry and prose. He has received fellowships from the Lannan and Guggenheim Foundations, the NEA, the New York Foundation for the Arts, and U.S. Artists. Other honors include the PEN/Voelcker Award for Poetry, the American Book Award from the Before Columbus Foundation, the Lenore Marshall Prize from the Academy of American Poets, and the Shelley Memorial Award from the Poetry Society of America. A contributing editor for Poets & Writers magazine, he is a distinguished professor of English and director of the MFA creative writing program at Rutgers University-Newark.

QUINCY TROUPE

Poet and author of 21 books, including 12 volumes of poetry and three children's books. Co-author of the definitive autobiography of Miles Davis, Miles: The Autobiography, Quincy Troupe also conducted the last interview with James Baldwin, reprinted as James Baldwin: The Last Interview (Melville House, New York 2014). His writings have been translated into over 30 languages. Among his many distinguished achievements are the Paterson Award for Sustained Literary Achievement, the Milt Kessler Poetry Award, three American Book Awards, the 2014 Gwendolyn Brooks Poetry Award, a 2014 Lifetime Achievement Award from Furious Flower, and the Charles H. Wright Museum of African American History Award, January 25, 2018, in Detroit Michigan.
